


Women make up half the population of the world, and a great deal of criminal violence is directed toward women. Every day in the United States, women are subjected to rapes and other sexual assaults, carjackings, robberies, abductions, and other crimes. In recent years, more and more women have been buying guns for personal protection, and more are entering the training field than ever before.

For over fifteen years, we have been conducting the annual Tactical Conference, the premier training event of the year. There have always been women in attendance at the Conference, but we have seen a sharp increase in the number of female attendees and pistol match competitors over the past

few years. In 2013, I believe we had 14 female participants; in 2014 that number was up to about 20; this year there were over 30. We also had a number of female trainers who presented blocks of instruction this year, including Lynn Givens, Tiffany Johnson, Lori Bigley, Eve Kulscar, Julie Thomas, and Linda Hoopes. Other female trainers in attendance included Vicki Farnam, Robyn Street, and Gail Pepin.


There were several topics presented this year of specific interest to ladies. Lori Bigley put on a detailed presentation on holsters and other carry options for women. Claude Werner and Linda Hoopes gave a presentation on tactical communication for couples. Southnarc, and Karl Rehn and Caleb Causey put on live force on force scenario-based training that applied to either gender. The 2016 event will feature a number of female trainers and new blocks of instruction.



Most of you have heard me mention 62 wins/zero losses/3 forfeits. At last count (Jan 2015) we have had 65 students involved in defensive shootings that I know of. These are students who have reported back to the school or have been reported to me through law enforcement channels. Of those, every single one who were armed at the time of the event won their fight (62 wins). No student of ours who was armed at the time has been killed. However, three students found themselves in need of a defensive handgun and did not have one. All three were killed in separate street robberies. In the last incident, the victim had handed over his wallet and cell phone and was standing there with his hands in the air when he was shot in the face and killed. These are the three forfeits.

In March, Lynn and I taught a series of courses in Florida. The classes were held on the weekends, so during the week we got to play tourist. On one of our excursions we went on an airboat tour in the Everglades. Below is a photo of us from that excursion. I am wearing a Glock 35 in my JM Custom Kydex IWB holster, plus 2 spare magazines, under a simple silk shirt. Lynn is utilizing a belly band to carry her S&W Shield 9mm discretely concealed under a very feminine blouse. We spent the entire day in a variety of activities around scores of other tourists and no one had a clue that either of us was armed. Carrying a concealed handgun is simply not as difficult as people like to make it out to be. Find a handgun/holster combination that fits your body type, cover it up, and get on with life. ■




TOM'S BOOK

THE RANGEMASTER-Q TARGET

For a few years now, we have been using a target of our own design for the Tactical Conference pistol match and in our training courses. This target is called the Rangemaster-Q, and we designed it to address several issues. The target represents the upper torso and head of a grown adult male. The bottom of the target extends only an inch or two below the diaphragm. This makes the target much smaller than your typical silhouette and thus does not reward low torso



hits that would be of little value in a fight. In the chest of the target is a faintly outlined box that is seven inches wide and nine inches deep. This corresponds exactly to the area from the collarbone to the diaphragm and inside the nipples. In the head there is a 3x3" ocular window. The way we normally score this target, a hit inside the chest box or the head box counts for five points, and a hit anywhere else in the gray silhouette counts for three points. Shots outside the silhouette (of course) count for zero points.

The target itself is a dull, neutral gray color, and the scoring lines cannot be seen while shooting. This forces the shooter to engage the correct part of the target without visible scoring lines. This target is available from Gun Fun Targets (see www.gunfun.com/shop/rangemaster-q-22660/). In quantities from 50 to 99, the cost is .85 each. If you order 100-249 the price drops to .29 each, and quantities of 250 and above are even cheaper. Gun Fun offers free shipping, which is a
